The meeting will start promptly at 7:00 p.m. under the chair of *Richard Scandaliato*, SSCA President. The meeting will include introductions of 2017 Board Members and the new slate of proposed officers and Board Members for 2018. Association members that have volunteered for various events in 2017 will be introduced and acknowledged. Secretary *Jerry Gaines* will then conduct the election of officers.

Our overall theme for 2018 is volunteerism for the benefit of our neighborhood. *Ed Storti* will provide a brief outline of our upcoming Towne Hall meeting. *Rich Scandaliato* will expand on this theme and discuss the Board's Strategic Plan and initiatives for 2018 including re-establishment of the Welcome Wagon for the many new residents moving into South Shores each year.

At approximately **8:20 p.m.**, the meeting will be opened as a **general discussion forum** focusing on ideas for future Towne Hall informational meetings and other matters that are of interest to the members in attendance.

President's Point

Dear fellow South Shores residents,

We're hoping your holidays were safe, happy and healthy ones.

In 2018, it is SSCA's goal to listen and build communication with members to effectively serve the South Shores community.

During 2017, SSCA carefully listened to the variety of topics concerning South Shores residents most. In doing so, SSCA's emphasis for the future became clear.



We will continue to focus on projects that serve residents interests in the spheres of:

- Social and informational events that bring our residents together.
- Safety and Security of our homes.
- Advocacy with public officials aimed at preserving and protecting South Shores' quality of life.

Some of these projects are ambitious ones. They can't be carried out by just a small group of Board members. The projects require workers. They require volunteers to carry out the mission.

Because of this, SSCA may occasionally call upon you to devote a small amount of your time to assist with a specific project. It's true that many residents are time-starved. Many have families and careers. However, a small team of volunteers willing to pitch in with an occasional task is our best hope in building and protecting South Shores, this wonderful community we all call home.

Some high spots in 2017:

- Our first SSCA Towne Hall meeting. It was very well attended and taught us much about our community's desire to make South Shores an even more secure place to live.
- Parking lot illumination in Bogdanovich Park was increased from one to seven lights. Result: increased security and safety of this area. This was achieved through strengthened communication with LA Rec and Park management, bolstered by the community's input on security concerns.
- Added security to Bogdanovich Park was also achieved through increased community involvement. These measures include a marked increase in consistent nightly patrols, reconfiguring the parking lot for increased visibility to deter criminal activity and community monitoring of nightly gate closings.
- A new, more user-friendly SSCA website. Now nearly completed, this site is slated to bring news, photos and videos of activities relevant to South Shores life. It will be able accessible by clicking on www.southshoresca.org.
- The best attended annual social event in South Shores history. Hosted by our very gracious hosts, John and Lucrecia Jacobson, this delightful event brought neighbors together for a truly memorable afternoon of food, beverage and entertainment. The bonus: it was held at one of the most beautifully scenic white water ocean view homes on the bluffs of South Shores. (cont. Pg4)



Some goals for 2018:

- Increasing membership in the South Shores Community Association through expanded communication efforts. This year, after no increase in membership dues for decades, SSCA will raise the annual membership dues to a still affordable \$20.00 per year. This increase will help fund many of the projects and efforts that require postage, printing services and materials, rental of equipment for meetings. The major expense has been the food, beverage and entertainment costs of our annual social event each September.
- **SSCA's second Towne Hall** meeting scheduled for the February/March period (date pending at time of this publication). The meeting's topic "Health Fair" is aimed at providing information to keep us all healthy and fit.
- **Establishing a "Welcome Wagon"** to warmly greet new South Shores residents to our community. This is one of the projects where SSCA volunteers can play a meaningful role.
- **Expanding the Cyber Watch concept,** already over 500 members strong after 5 years of operation.

Why is the SSCA raising its annual membership dues?

- I. Dues have been at \$10.00 for over 15-yrs.
- 2. The cost for printing and mailing various communications; including the VIEWPOINT continues to increase.
- 3. Despite the many donations, the cost of the SSCA annual reception for food, beverages, plates, place settings, paper goods, and entertainment has increased.
- 4. Insurance to cover the annual reception is a necessity to protect both the SSCA and the host.
- 5. The restart of a neighborhood "**WELCOME WAGON**" requires funding for an appropriate gift; roughly 40 new residents per year.
- 6. Expansion of **TOWNE HALL** meetings may include mailings, beverages and possible fee for a venue.
- 7. Recognizing civic leaders for their accomplishments, board members both present and past for their dedicated service and impact on the South Shores community, providing nominal gifts for those hosting the SSCA annual reception all of which require budgetary funding
- 8. Cost for Web hosting.

CyberWatch...on the Grow!

Hi folks,

This month, January 2018, begins CyberWatch's 6th year. Really hard to believe.

To sum up 2017, it's been an interesting year:

The South Shores CyberWatch network has now grown to over 500 members. That's about 100 members more than January of 2017. That's a lot of folks watching out for each other. Their vigilance and reports made the difference in keeping South Shores one of

the safest neighborhoods in Los Angeles over the past 5 years.

In the first half of 2017, burglaries were trending upward over previous years...until late July. On July 27, a burglary ring of three ransacked a home in

upper South Shores. It was the same ring that targeted RPV homes and, possibly, other South Shores residences early in the year.

The team of burglars was stunned when they found themselves surrounded by patrol cars and arrested less than a week later at the corner of 25th and Moray.

This feat was made possible through very fluid communication between CyberWatch members, RPV neighborhood watch groups and excellent video surveillance. This was capped by highly responsive LAPD patrols under the direction of Harbor LAPD's Captain Michael Oreb.

We've heard that burglary ring members share info with other burglary rings. Hard to tell how much of that applies here, but after those arrests last summer, there has not been another reported burglary in South Shores as of late-December of 2017, when this issue went to press.

Much of the credit goes to those informed and vigilant residents who care enough about their community to get involved and report suspicious activities as they happen.

This was not the only CyberWatch success story of 2017, but it was a memorable one.

In the second half of 2017, LAPD's Captain Oreb and his staff reached out to SSCA to ask if we would assist in helping replicate the CyberWatch

> concept in Wilmington and Harbor City, as well as other San Pedro neighborhoods, such as Point Fermin, Palisades and Vista del Oro. This resulted in a series of meetings

> September with Block Captains from those areas. There seems to be great interest from these communities to try the idea that's working in South Shores. This mentorship is slated to continue into 2018.

Also, CyberWatch has now formed an information sharing link with the Rancho Palos Verdes neighborhoods of Seaview, Ladera Linda and Mediterranea. We expect more RPV neighborhoods will join the link up with CyberWatch in 2018.

CyberWatch has not put an end to thefts in South Shores. Thefts from vehicles will continue to be a



sad reality. They'll continue so long as folks forget to lock their vehicles or leave items of value in them.

As for home burglaries, things have been quiet for a while. But there will always be a new crop of bad guys wanting our stuff badly enough to enter our homes and take it from us. They're willing to take such risks.

So long as CyberWatchers stay vigilant, we'll keep proving to them their risk isn't worth it. They'll go to jail and things will quiet down again...for awhile.

Private Security Patrol Research Findings

RECAP

In 2016, at the request South Shores residents, the South Shores Community Association was asked to determine whether a private security patrol program for South Shores could be a feasible and sustainable concept.

SSCA studied a similar private security patrol service operating in a 2,000 home area in Santa Monica since 1984 and subsequently reported its findings to South Shores residences.

WHERE THINGS STAND NOW

To test the potential willingness of South Shores residents to fund the security patrol program through payment of annual dues, Mr. Derek Johnson has formed a group of South Shores volunteers to advance this effort.

Mr. Johnson informs us that the volunteer team is working on a mailer to reach out to the remaining 900 South Shores households and obtain a more complete picture of South Shores willingness to participate.

South Shores residents need to know that in the coming months leading into 2023 there will be much activity in the harbor area associated with construction of a 22 foot in diameter sanitation tunnel coming from

Named by Spanish explorer Sebastian Vizcaino, who anchored here on Saint Peter's Day, November 26, 1602. Rancho San Pedro's name was derived from the Bay of San Pedro on which it was bordered.

Named in 1793 by British explorer George Vancouver as a thank you to Father Fermin Francisco de Lasuen for the hospitality he showed Vancouver and his crew at the mission in Carmel.

Bogdanovich Park

Named after Martin Bogdanovich, founder of Star Kist Tuna.

the Harbor/Carson waste treatment plant to Royal Palm Beach. Hearings and workshops have occurred over the past few months outlining the planned activities for the new tunnel. A tunnel boring machine will be placed underground at the Carson site located near the corner of Lomita Blvd. and Figueroa St., removing excavated material as it moves south to Royal Palms Beach. Impact to our area will be at Royal Palms Beach around 2023 where the boring machine is removed and the beach area restored to its original state. There will be temporary walls used to buffer construction activity during that process. The new tunnel will be connected to the current outfall system at Royal Palms Beach.
