Recently, there's been a disturbing number of arson fires in the White Point Nature Preserve. It's not known whether these fires are related to the apparent arson attempt in Bogdanovich Park on Dec. 5.

*STOLEN VEHICLES

In the past 3 months alone, there've been a total of 83 stolen vehicles in San Pedro. Up from 50 in the last quarter. It's believed that organized crime is behind this sharp increase. Gang recruits use digital technology to capture your fob's continuous signal remotely from outside your home. Once the signal is captured, they can open your car door and, in newer models, start your car's ignition and drive it away. If you'd like to prevent this from happening to your car, as explained in past CyberWatch Updates, simply store your fob overnight in a tin container or in an inexpensive Faraday pouch available through Amazon. This tin or pouch will block your fob's signal...and prevent your car... from being stolen remotely

In the meantime, stay well...stay safe. Observe and report...
